

Increase attendance % in Christian Fellowship

School Context

SMK (P) Pudu is a mission school that is aiming to achieve high performing results in both academics and co-curricular activities. One of them is Christian Fellowship in school. CF is not just important for co-curricular activities but it is essential for the students' spiritual growth. In increasing the attendance, CF aims to help journey with the students and help them gain eternal values.

Initial Data

Data 1: Members' survey



30%

students feel **less connected with other members** of the Christian Fellowship.



73.5%

members want more **social activities and games** that can help strengthen relationships within CF.



47.1%

members have difficulty attending CF **due to academic matters** such as tuition.

Data 2: Member's attendance

Findings: Attendance is inconsistent. Attendance among Form 1 and 2 students is lower compared to other forms.

Data 3: PAJSK Grade Analysis and Involvement in Competitions

Findings: Students have not yet been involved in any activities under the CF.

Problem Statement

47.1% (which contributes to the unstable attendance and lower participation from Form 1 and 2 students) stated that they could not attend CF due to academic commitments. Additionally, 30% of students who do attend feel that they are not close to the other members. As a result, 73.5% of members expressed a desire for more social activities and games that could help strengthen relationships within CF. At the time this issue was documented, attendance stood at approximately 55%.

Planning: Logic Model



1 CF teacher advisor

7 main CF committee members

Allocation from the Board of Governors (BOG) and the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)

Equipment available in the Chapel

At least 5 CF activities with social and game elements that can be conducted by students within 3 months.

Conduct personal interviews with 3 students after 3 months to gather their feedback.

At least 60% attendance for all CF activities that include social and game elements.

3 students are able to give one suggestion each to improve CF attendance.

By June, attendance will be stable at a minimum of 60%.

80% of students will agree that they feel closer to CF members.

At least 3 students can share more confidently in CF.

At least 2 students can learn to manage CF activities more effectively with the help of the teacher.

CF members will promote CF without prompting from the teacher.

CF committee members will be able to run CF without teacher intervention.

CF members will be more courageous in sharing about Jesus with their friends.

Many CF members will be non-Christian students.

Implementation



Social and fun activities held which managed to garner around 45% attendance for this activity

Easter Celebration where attendance was up to 56% and included 100+ participants from other schools

Analysis: **58% of the students** achieved a decent score for their participation in their co-curricular activities even with very few competitions available to them.

Outcome

1. Even though the desired outcome was not achieved through the percentage of attendance, the bond between the CF students have increased.
2. An interview with a few students also indicated that they have been able to improve their leadership and planning and even more comfortable to share when called upon.

Next Steps

1. Continue the project using Replicate and Duplicate strategy. Social activities and games to be continued as they attract the most attendance.
2. Students committee to be more involved in Word sharing so that it is more relatable to them.
3. Conduct a post-mortem to look for room for improvement that will help increase the attendance.
